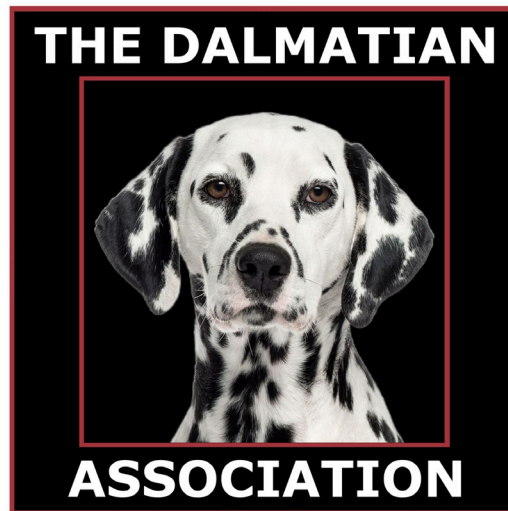

Prize Money

Prize money is on offer for Best In show, Reserve Best in show, Best puppy in show, Best Veteran In show, limited to paid up club members of the Dalmatian Association .

Definition of Classes

Baby Puppy Aged 4 to 6 months on the day of the show. The winner of this class cannot compete for Best Puppy in Show but will receive a Special Prize.

Puppy Aged 6 months to 12 months on the day of the show

Yearling Aged 12 months to 24 months on the day of the show

Post Graduate For dogs which have not won five or more first prizes at Kennel Club Shows (excluding puppy classes)

Limit For dogs which have not won seven or more first prizes at Kennel Club Shows (excluding puppy classes)

Open For dogs up to seven years old on the day of the show

Champion Restricted to dogs that have won at least three Challenge Certificates, resulting in a Champion title. The winner of this class cannot compete for any Best in Show but will receive a Special Prize. All dogs with a Champion title must enter in the Champion class irrespective of age

Veteran For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the show

Classes for our all-breed fun show will be advertised separately.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The show will open at **9:00am**.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence at **10:00am**.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. Entry fees: Members 1st entry £3.00; subsequent entries £2.00. Non Members 1st entry £4.00; subsequent entries £3.00. Catalogues £2.50. Online entries only available at www.onlineshowentry.com
6. Prize money is offered to BIS, RBIS, BPIS, BVIS to paid up members of the Dalmatian Association only
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under four of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
10. Best Puppy in Show

Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. The selection of Best in Show may follow the selection of Best Puppy in Show and Best Veteran in Show (if scheduled) respectively. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge be Best Puppy in Show respectively. A Baby Puppy is a dog of four and less than six calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Baby Puppy classes may be scheduled at any breed club show. Any Variety Baby Puppy classes may be scheduled at any breed club show. Best Baby Puppy in Breed may be declared in each breed from the dogs entered in the Baby Puppy breed classes. There must be no progression to further competition

11. Best in Show
Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.

13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable.

14. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS**

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

15. Anyone whose dog is entered at the event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.

16. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry.

17. Societies may accept Not for Competition entries at their discretion for dogs aged three calendar months and over.

18. No modifications will be made to the schedule.

19. An exhibitor or competitor should ensure that contact details for any handler are available and must be provided upon request in any investigation of a breach of this regulation by such handler.
